

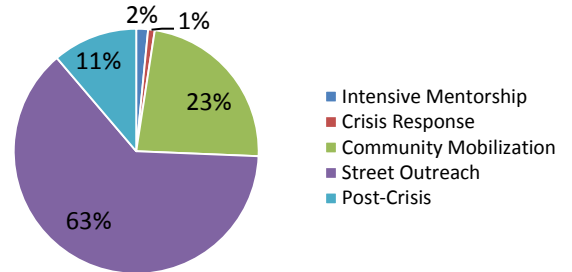


San Francisco Street Violence Intervention Program (SVIP) Monthly Snapshot – April 2017

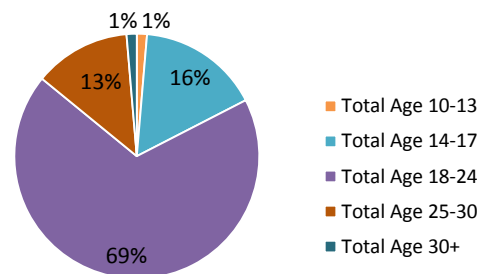

29% of outreach activities (185 of 632)² occurred in **Housing Developments**

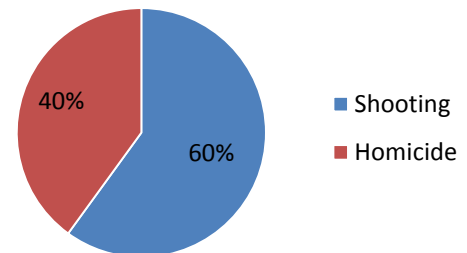
Crisis Response

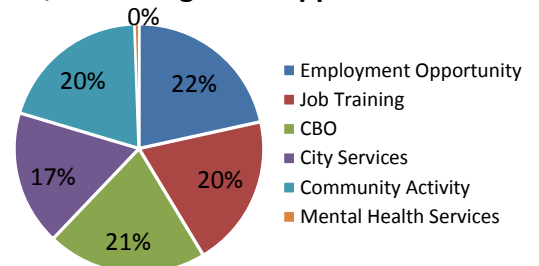
Street Outreach

Conduct intervention and Prevention through daily canvassing of identified schools and neighborhood “hot zones”

3,763 individuals contacted through daily street outreach

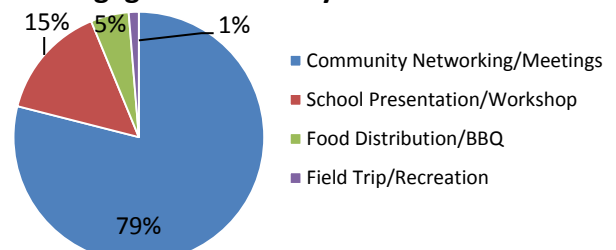
Community Mobilization

Provide public education and community mobilization efforts in neighborhood “hot zones”

1227 individuals attended 50 community activities
