

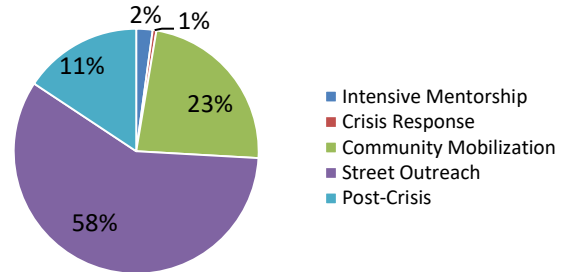


San Francisco Street Violence Intervention Program (SVIP) Monthly Snapshot – August 2017

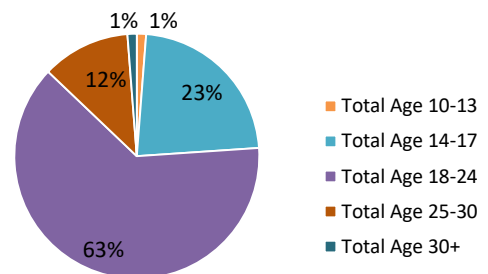

30% of outreach activities (167 of 563)² occurred in **Housing Developments**

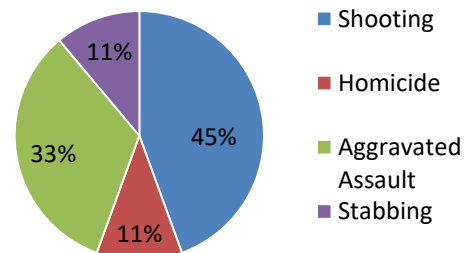
Crisis Response

Events Included 1 Homicide and 4 Shootings



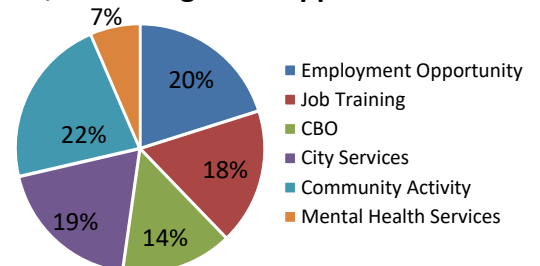
Street Outreach

Conduct intervention and Prevention through daily canvassing of identified schools and neighborhood “hot zones”

4,629 individuals contacted through daily street outreach

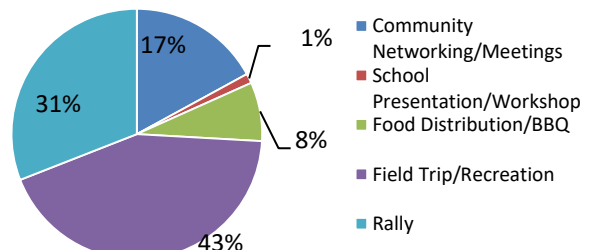
Community Mobilization

Provide public education and community mobilization efforts in neighborhood “hot zones”

1,842 individuals attended 55 community activities
