

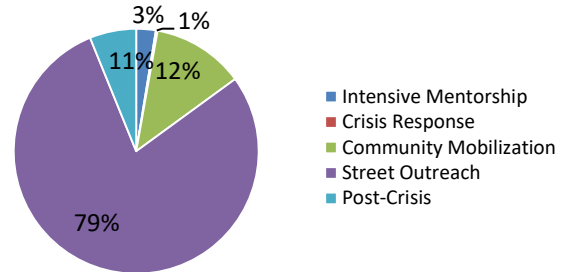


San Francisco Street Violence Intervention Program (SVIP) Monthly Snapshot – October 2017

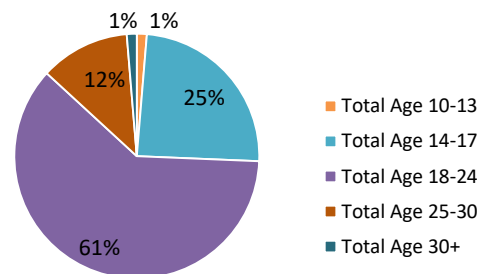

43% of outreach activities (250 of 559)² occurred in **Housing Developments**

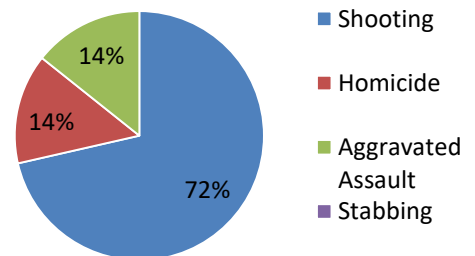
Crisis Response

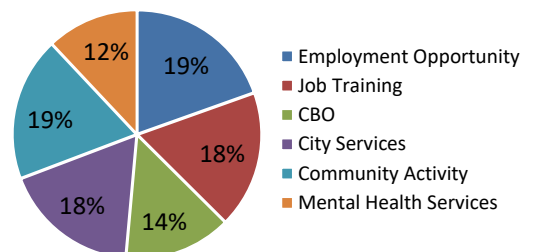
Street Outreach

Conduct intervention and Prevention through daily canvassing of identified schools and neighborhood “hot zones”

4,901 individuals contacted through daily street outreach

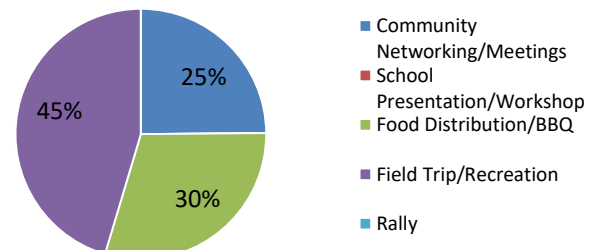
Community Mobilization

Provide public education and community mobilization efforts in neighborhood “hot zones”

756 individuals attended 33 community activities
