

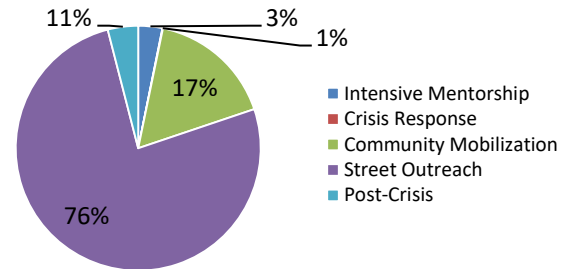


San Francisco Street Violence Intervention Program (SVIP) Monthly Snapshot – January 2018

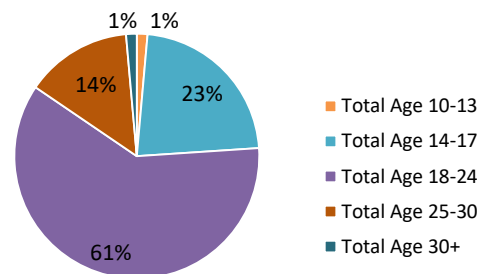

52% of outreach activities (248 of 474)² occurred in **Housing Developments**

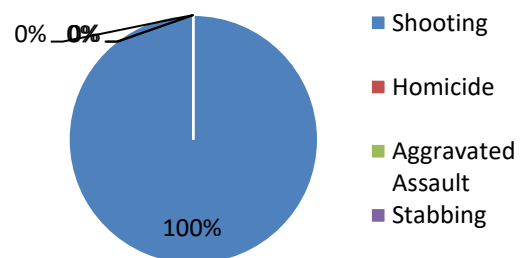
Crisis Response

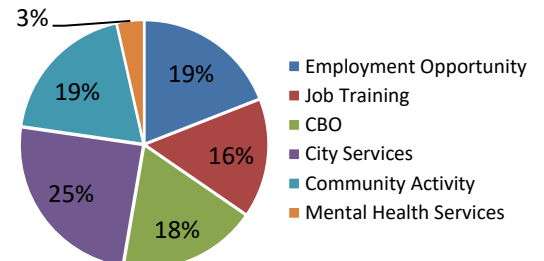
Street Outreach

Conduct intervention and Prevention through daily canvassing of identified schools and neighborhood “hot zones”

3,595 individuals contacted through daily street outreach

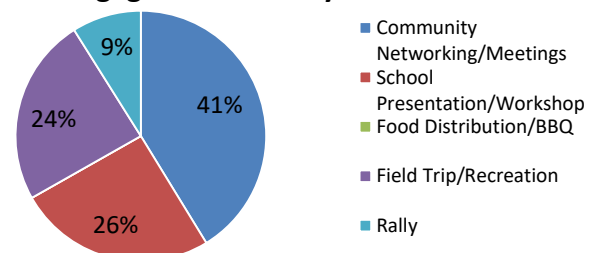
Community Mobilization

Provide public education and community mobilization efforts in neighborhood “hot zones”

783 individuals attended 35 community activities
