

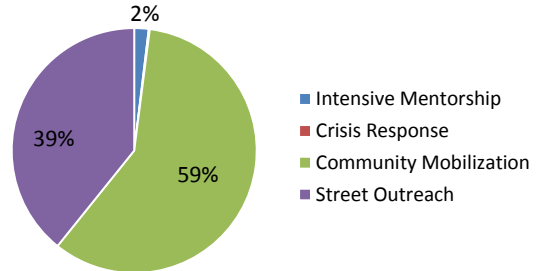


San Francisco Street Violence Intervention Program (SVIP) Monthly Snapshot - July 2015

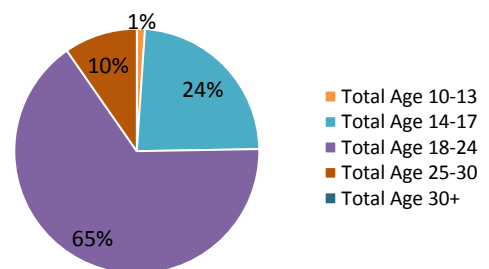

Crisis Response

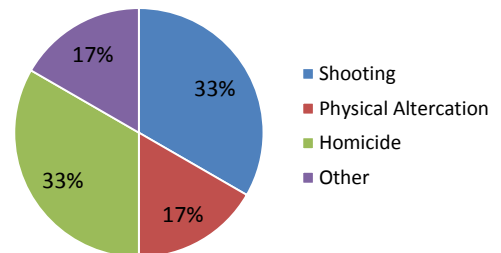
Respond to youth-related homicides, shootings, and stabbings to reduce the rate of violent incidents

Events Included 2 Homicides and 2 Non-fatal Shootings



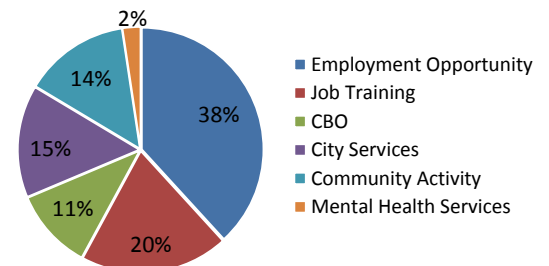
Street Outreach

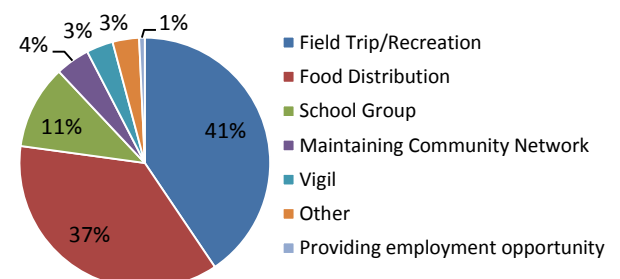
Community Mobilization
