

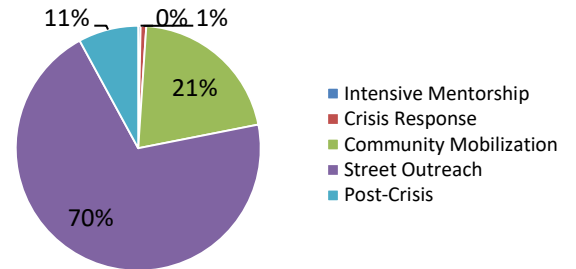


San Francisco Street Violence Intervention Program (SVIP) Semi-Annual Snapshot – January through December 2017

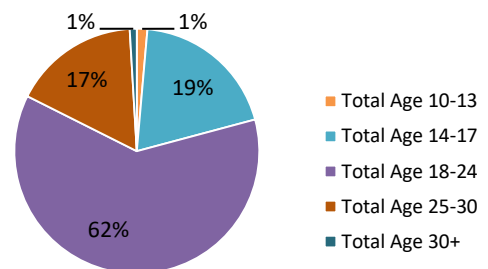

41% of outreach activities (2,270 of 5,508)² occurred in **Housing Developments**

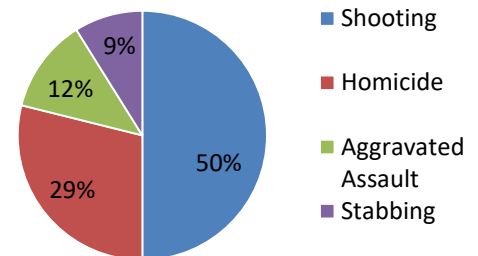
Crisis Response

Respond to youth-related homicides, shootings, and stabbings to reduce the rate of violent incidents

SVIP responded to 90 crisis events

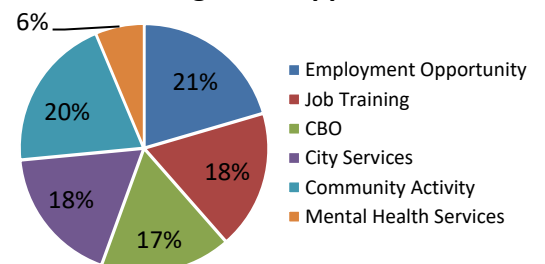
Street Outreach

Conduct intervention and Prevention through daily canvassing of identified schools and neighborhood “hot zones”

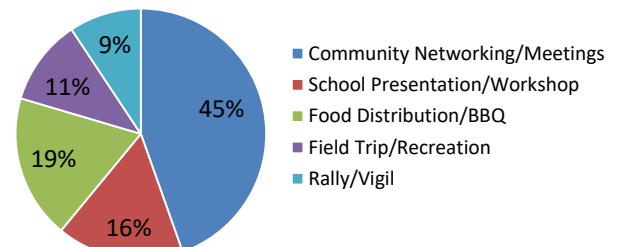
Community Mobilization
