



San Francisco Street Violence Intervention Program (SVIP) **Monthly Snapshot - December 2017**

Crisis Response


Respond to youth-related homicides, shootings, and stabbings to reduce the rate of violent incidents

Events Included 3 Shootings and 3 Homicides




Street Outreach




Community Mobilization
