



### San Francisco Street Violence Intervention Program (SVIP) Monthly Snapshot – February 2017

#### **Crisis Response**


Respond to youth-related homicides, shootings, and stabbings to reduce the rate of violent incidents

## Events Included 10 Shootings, 2 Homicides, and 2 Stabbings




#### **Street Outreach**

Conduct intervention and Prevention through daily canvassing of identified schools and neighborhood "hot zones"

#### 5,385 individuals contacted through daily street outreach
