



San Francisco Street Violence Intervention Program (SVIP) Monthly Snapshot – July 2017

Crisis Response


Respond to youth-related homicides, shootings, and stabbings to reduce the rate of violent incidents

Events Included 5 Homicides and 2 Shootings




Street Outreach


Community Mobilization
