

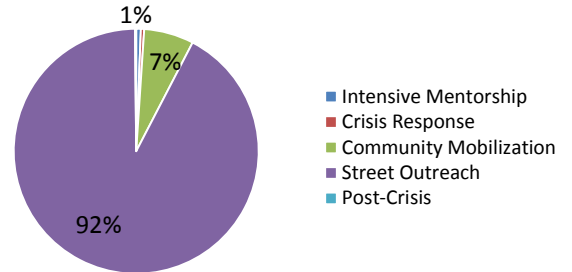


San Francisco Street Violence Intervention Program (SVIP) Monthly Snapshot – March 2017

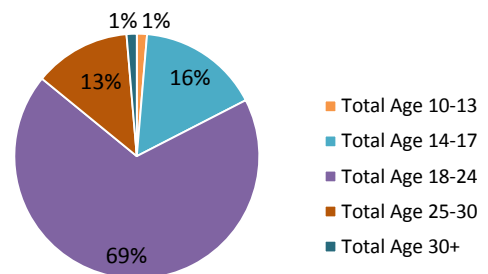

31% of outreach activities (235 of 738)² occurred in **Housing Developments**

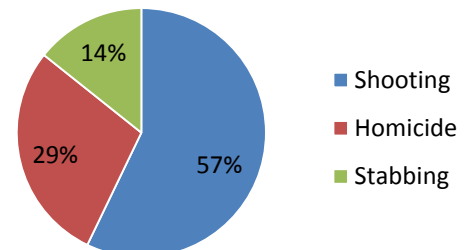
Crisis Response

Respond to youth-related homicides, shootings, and stabbings to reduce the rate of violent incidents

SVIP responded to 7 crisis events

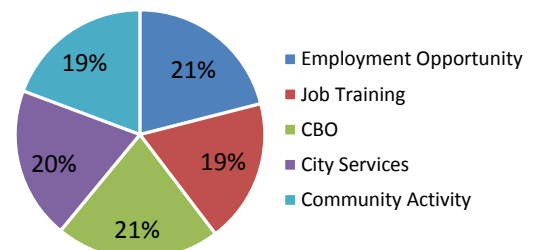
Street Outreach

Conduct intervention and Prevention through daily canvassing of identified schools and neighborhood “hot zones”

5,287 individuals contacted through daily street outreach

2,534 Linkages to Supportive Services

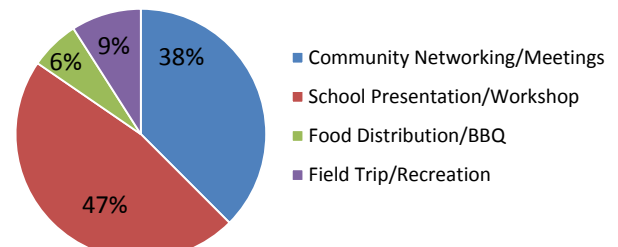
Community Mobilization

Provide public education and community mobilization efforts in neighborhood “hot zones”

319 individuals attended 36 community activities
