



San Francisco Street Violence Intervention Program (SVIP) Monthly Snapshot - March 2017

Crisis Response


Respond to youth-related homicides, shootings, and stabbings to reduce the rate of violent incidents

Events Included 2 Homicides, 4 Shootings, and 1 Stabbing




Street Outreach


Community Mobilization
