



San Francisco Street Violence Intervention Program (SVIP) Q1 Snapshot: January – March 2017

Crisis Response


Respond to youth-related homicides, shootings, and stabbings to reduce the rate of violent incidents

Events Included 19 Shootings and 8 Homicides




Street Outreach

Conduct intervention and Prevention through daily canvassing of identified schools and neighborhood "hot zones"

13,537 individuals contacted through daily street outreach
