



# San Francisco Street Violence Intervention Program (SVIP) Quarterly Snapshot – July through September 2017

#### **Crisis Response**


Respond to youth-related homicides, shootings, and stabbings to reduce the rate of violent incidents




#### **Street Outreach**


### **Community Mobilization**
