

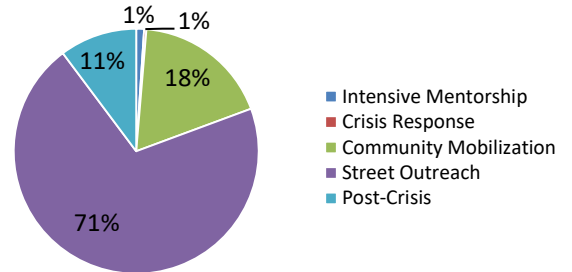


San Francisco Street Violence Intervention Program (SVIP) Quarterly Snapshot – July through September 2017

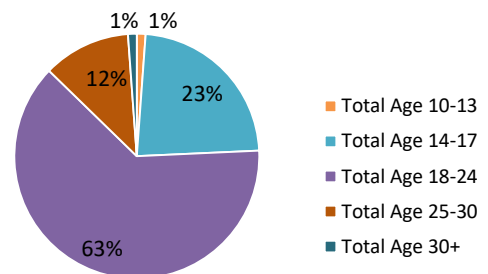

29% of outreach activities (523 of 1,775)² occurred in **Housing Developments**

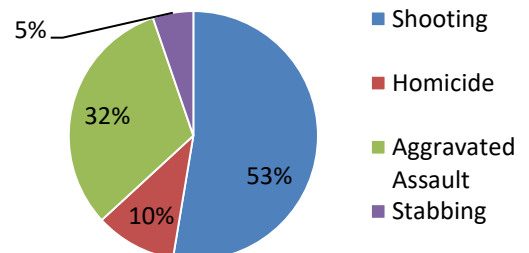
Crisis Response

Respond to youth-related homicides, shootings, and stabbings to reduce the rate of violent incidents

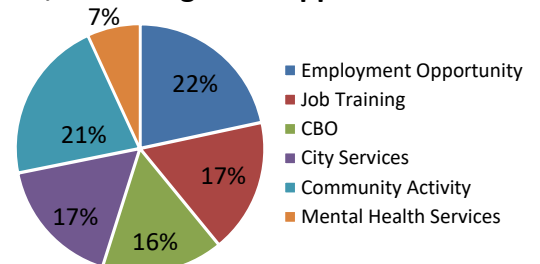
Street Outreach

Conduct intervention and Prevention through daily canvassing of identified schools and neighborhood “hot zones”

12,422 individuals contacted through daily street outreach

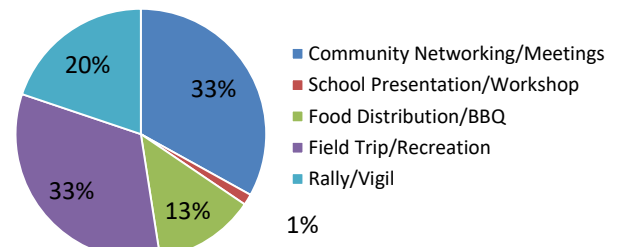
Community Mobilization

Provide public education and community mobilization efforts in neighborhood “hot zones”

3,179 individuals attended 147 community activities
