



San Francisco Street Violence Intervention Program (SVIP) **Monthly Snapshot - November 2016**

Crisis Response


Respond to youth-related homicides, shootings, and stabbings to reduce the rate of violent incidents

Events Included 9 Shootings and 1 Homicides




Street Outreach
