

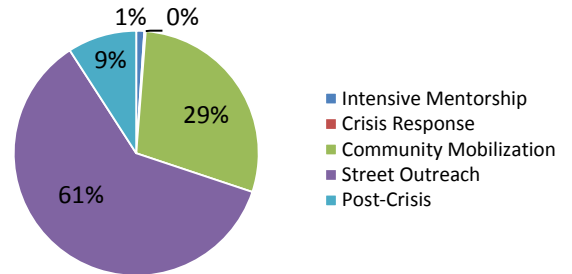


San Francisco Street Violence Intervention Program (SVIP) Q3 Snapshot: July – September 2016

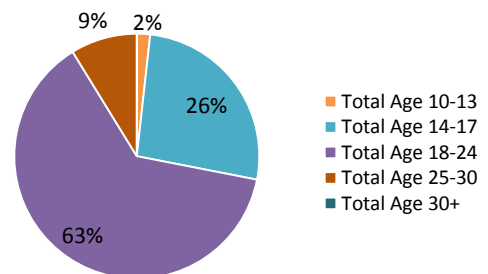

25% of outreach activities (469 of 1,876)² occurred in **Housing Developments**

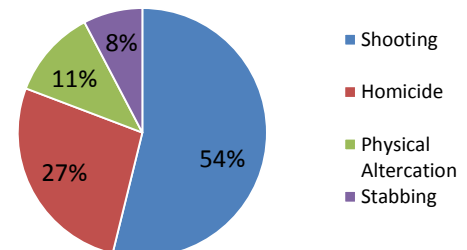
Crisis Response

Respond to youth-related homicides, shootings, and stabbings to reduce the rate of violent incidents

SVIP responded to 26 crisis events

Crisis Events Included 14 Shootings, 7 Homicides, 3 Physical Altercations, and 2 Stabbings



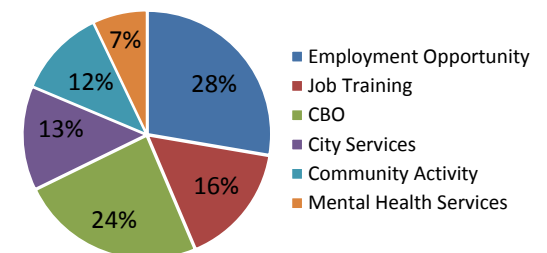
Street Outreach

Conduct intervention and Prevention through daily canvassing of identified schools and neighborhood “hot zones”

9,771 individuals contacted through daily street outreach

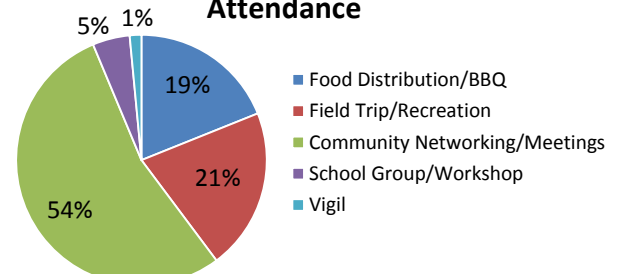
Community Mobilization

Provide public education and community mobilization efforts in neighborhood “hot zones”

4645 individuals attended 182 community activities
