

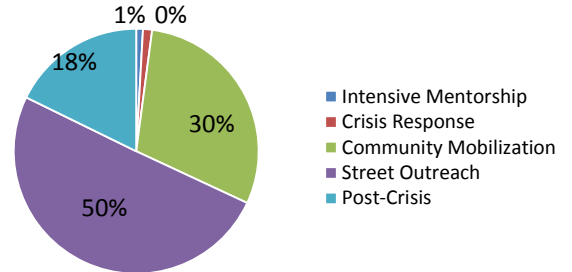


San Francisco Street Violence Intervention Program (SVIP) Q4 Snapshot: October – December 2016

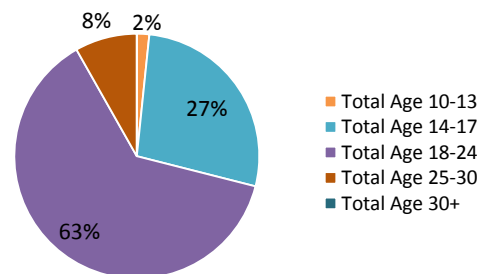

30% of outreach activities (496 of 1,655)² occurred in **Housing Developments**

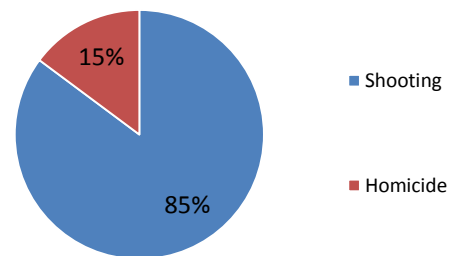
Crisis Response

Respond to youth-related homicides, shootings, and stabbings to reduce the rate of violent incidents

SVIP responded to 27 crisis events

Crisis Events Included 23 Shootings and 4 Homicides



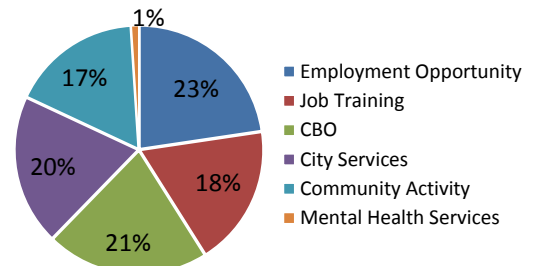
Street Outreach

Conduct intervention and Prevention through daily canvassing of identified schools and neighborhood “hot zones”

10,345 individuals contacted through daily street outreach

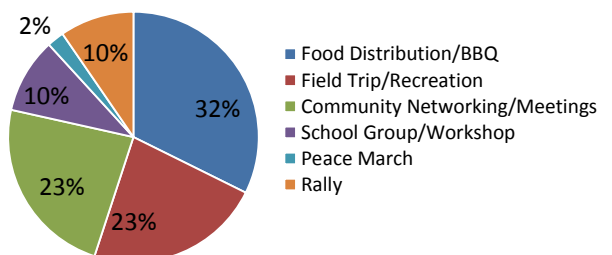
Community Mobilization

Provide public education and community mobilization efforts in neighborhood “hot zones”

6,139 individuals attended 146 community activities
