



San Francisco Street Violence Intervention Program (SVIP) Monthly Snapshot – February 2016

Crisis Response


Respond to youth-related homicides, shootings, and stabbings to reduce the rate of violent incidents

Events Included 5 Shootings and 1 Homicide




Street Outreach

Conduct intervention and Prevention through daily canvassing of identified schools and neighborhood "hot zones"

2,708 individuals contacted through daily street outreach
