

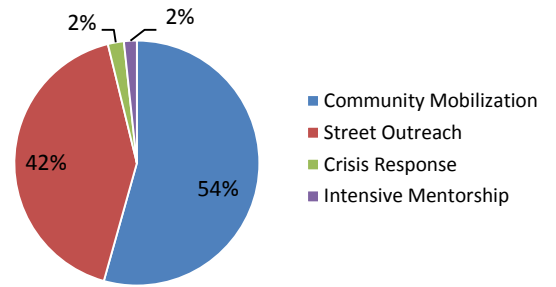


San Francisco Street Violence Intervention Program (SVIP) Quarterly Snapshot – October - December 2015

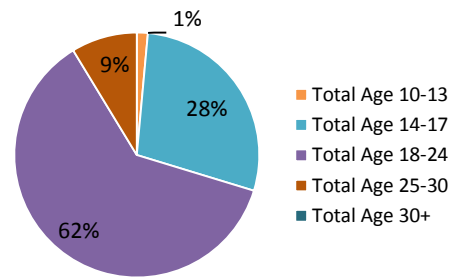

Crisis Response

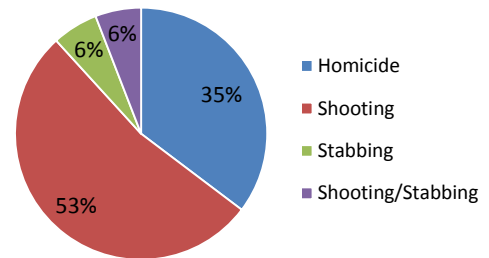
Respond to youth-related homicides, shootings, and stabbings to reduce the rate of violent incidents

SVIP responded to 17 crisis events

Events included 6 Homicides and 9 Non-fatal Shootings



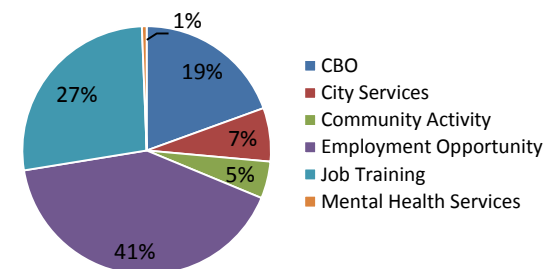
Street Outreach

Conduct intervention and Prevention through daily canvassing of identified schools and neighborhood “hot zones”

3,405 individuals contacted through daily canvassing

976 Linkages to Supportive Services



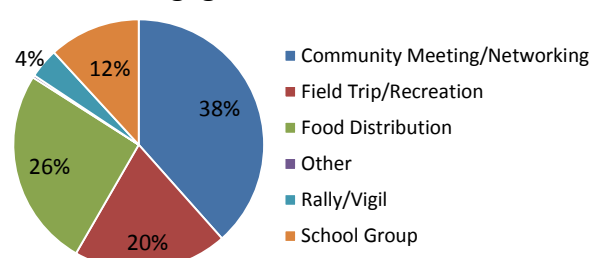
Community Mobilization

Provide public education and community mobilization efforts in neighborhood “hot zones”

4,423 individuals attended 152 community activities
