

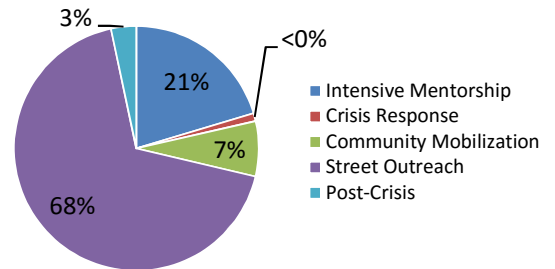


San Francisco Street Violence Intervention Program (SVIP) Monthly Snapshot – September 2016

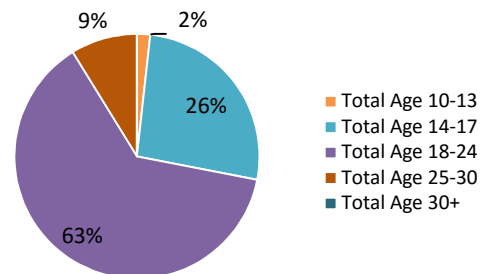

Crisis Response

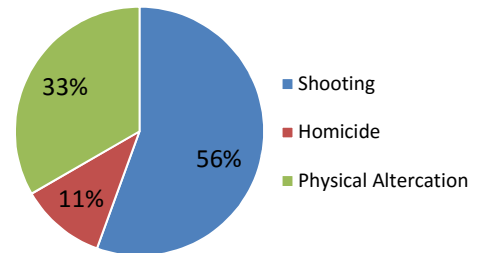
Respond to youth-related homicides, shootings, and stabbings to reduce the rate of violent incidents

SVIP responded to 9 crisis events

Events Included 5 Shootings, 1 Homicide, and 3 Physical Altercations



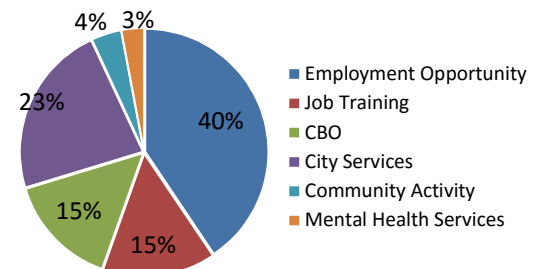
Street Outreach

Conduct intervention and Prevention through daily canvassing of identified schools and neighborhood “hot zones”

2,467 individuals contacted through daily street outreach

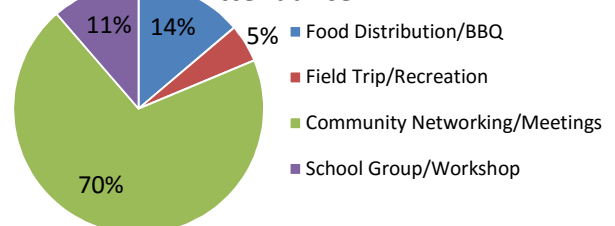
Community Mobilization

775 individuals attended 61 community activities
